

Studies in Stockholm

Middle of August 2018 to middle/end of January 2019

with focus on Dalcroze Eurythmics

Students in the B.A. (M&S) second year or B.Mus. third year or B.A Hons. or M.Mus. first year who are interested to study as an exchange student at the Royal College of Music in Stockholm, should write *a short email* to Prof Taljaard before 09:00 on Wednesday, 9 May.

If you are in the third year of B.Mus., you must be registered for **Music Education** as a module. (*Please note:* this refers to General Music Education, and not to Didactics of an Instrument.)

If you are a B.A. Hons or M.Mus. student, your research must focus on Dalcroze Eurythmics. This focus must be clear in your research proposal.

In the email you should provide information on the following. This information will be used in order to rank the applications of all who applied.

- 1) Why do you wish to study the Dalcroze approach?
- 2) What are your experiences as music educator? Give information on projects that you have been involved in that have had some demonstrable impact in your community.
- 3) How do you plan to apply the experiences in the Dalcroze Approach when you return to South Africa?

Please also attach an academic record. Students who have passed all their subjects up to the end of 2017 will be ranked higher in the selection than those who have failed one or more modules. Also ensure that the record contains the subjects for which you are registered in the second semester of 2018.
