



Policy on academic dishonesty, including plagiarism

- 1. The School of Music is bound by and supports the NWU Policy on Academic Integrity (available at http://www.nwu.ac.za/sites/www.nwu.ac.za/files/files/i-governance-management/policy/2P-2.4.3.2 Academic%20integrity e.pdf).
- 2. Students should take particular note of their roles and responsibilities as stated in section 6.3 of the policy.
- 3. Students are specifically informed about plagiarism and how to avoid it in the Academic Literacy modules (ADLA111,112,122 / ALDE111,112,122) as well as certain musicology modules (MZSS219 / MUSS219 / MUSX211).
- 4. If a student is still not sufficiently informed, it is the student's responsibility to request guidance and assistance from the module lecturer and/or the programme leader <u>before</u> submitting any assignments.
- 5. All instances of academic dishonesty will be officially reported and investigated in accordance with the NWU Policy on Academic Integrity. Students found guilty will be subject to penalisation, ranging from a zero score for the assessment to expulsion from the university.
