

## **Policy on academic dishonesty, including plagiarism**

1. The School of Music is bound by and supports the NWU Policy on Academic Integrity (available at [http://www.nwu.ac.za/sites/www.nwu.ac.za/files/files/i-governance-management/policy/2P-2.4.3.2\\_Academic%20integrity\\_e.pdf](http://www.nwu.ac.za/sites/www.nwu.ac.za/files/files/i-governance-management/policy/2P-2.4.3.2_Academic%20integrity_e.pdf)).
2. Students should take particular note of their roles and responsibilities as stated in section 6.3 of the policy.
3. Students are specifically informed about plagiarism and how to avoid it in the Academic Literacy modules (ADLA111,112,122 / ALDE111,112,122) as well as certain musicology modules (MZSS219 / MUSS219 / MUSX211).
4. If a student is still not sufficiently informed, it is the student's responsibility to request guidance and assistance from the module lecturer and/or the programme leader before submitting any assignments.
5. All instances of academic dishonesty will be officially reported and investigated in accordance with the NWU Policy on Academic Integrity. Students found guilty will be subject to penalisation, ranging from a zero score for the assessment to expulsion from the university.

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
